Fraud or fraudulent acts are intentional things that are carried out to obtain financial benefits so that they have the potential to harm the state and cause the quality of health services to decline. The potential for fraud in health services is increasingly widespread due to pressure from the newly implemented financing system, opportunities due to lack of supervision and there is justification when committing fraud actions. This study aims at potential fraud against clinical codefication claims in health care facilities. The method used is a literature review study. Literature searches were conducted in September-October 2022 using PubMed, ScienceDirect, and Google Scholar databases. At the stage of searching, articles are limited to 2017-2022 publications.
